In this side-event, people get to hear Sámi youths view on challenges in fulfilment of the Sámi people's rights in Norway. In their presentation, they will tell the audience about chosen rights-issues, why they are concerned, how these issues concern Sámi youth, and how they affect the relationship between the Sámi and the non-Sámi. Gáldus part of the project is professional supervising of the youths in forehand of the event, and Gáldu will provide the audience background information of the cases chosen by the youths.

In addition, we will offer information about the Sami Pathfinders work in Norway.
